



Operators' licence commitments:

- The laws relating to the driving and operation of vehicles used under the licence are observed
- The rules on drivers' hours and tachographs must be observed, proper records kept and that they are made available on request
- Vehicles and trailers are not overloaded
- Vehicles must operate within the speed limits
- Vehicles and trailers, including hired vehicles and trailers must be kept in a fit and serviceable condition
- Defects or symptoms of defects must be promptly reported in writing by drivers and acted upon
- All maintenance records, safety inspections, routine maintenance and vehicle repair vehicles must be kept for 15 months and be made available on request.
- All operating centre restrictions must be adhered to
- In respect of each operating centre identified, that the number of maximum vehicles authorised for each operating centre (which will be vehicles and the number of trailers kept there) will not exceed the notified number on the licence
- That an unauthorised operating centre is not used in any traffic area
- Operators will notify the traffic commissioner of any convictions against himself, the company, business partner(s), company directors, nominated transport manager/s named in the application, or **employees or agents** of the applicant of the licence and, if the licence is issued, convictions against the licence holder or **employees or agents** of the licence holder.
- Ensure that the traffic commissioner is notified within 28 days of any other changes, for example a change to the proposed maintenance agreement; a change in the financial status of the licence holder (eg placed in liquidation or receivership) or a change to limited company status or partnership, that might affect the licence.
