Roads can be dangerous

cyclists and drivers show mutual respect cycle and drive safely

Safety advice for cyclists:

- Be visible to other road users, especially in the dark - wear light coloured / reflective clothing and accessories
 Ensure lights are working and clean
- Be safe where possible use cycle paths, instead of the road
- Be aware of vehicle blind spots don't undertake trucks, or other vehicles turning left
- Do not undertake a vehicle turning left and enter the ASL (Advanced Stop Line) area when the lights have been red for some time
 - If traffic lights have just turned red and you are confident take up a dominant position at the front of the ASL
 - Be ready to move promptly
- Make eye contact especially when using the (ASL)
- Be aware trucks need space to turn a truck turning left may start by moving to the right to create space
 Trucks are not as manoeuvrable as cars and cannot stop as quick

- Stay alert don't wear headphones they will distract you from vital safety awareness
- Protect yourself wear a good quality cycle helmet
- Cycle assertively don't hug the kerb
- Never use a mobile phone whilst cycling

Safety advice for truck drivers:

- Walk round check carry out a thorough documented walk round check before taking any vehicle on the road for the first time - ensure your vehicle is roadworthy and safe
- Remember the tachograph mode switch should reflect the activity when carrying out a vehicle check
- Blind Spots remember a cyclist could be in your blind spot
- Check and recheck mirrors there should be nothing in the sweep of the windscreen wipers obscuring vision
- Be courteous acknowledge cyclists making eye contact in the ASL (Advanced Stop Line). Give cyclists room and time
- When overtaking allow sufficient space for cyclists - remember potholes/adverse weather impact on a cyclist's stability
- Turning left be extra vigilant keep looking down left hand side of vehicle for cyclists in the blind spot
- Mirror, signal, manoeuvre ensure others are aware of your intentions
